## NPO DESPERATELY SEEKS DONATIONS FOR RELIEF 11 MAY 2020

The impact of the lockdown due to the Covid-19 pandemic is being felt by every section of the public, but particularly by vulnerable groups like people with disabilities (PWDs), and can even be lethal.

The increased risk to PWD in the time of COVID-19 pandemic is due to the need for close contact with personal assistants/caregivers, as well as an increased risk of infection and complications due to underlying health conditions and socioeconomic inequalities, including poor access to health care.

The lockdown caused the closure of special care centres for children with severe and profound disabilities, protective workshops and social work service offices (although social work staff continue to provide counselling and services to those in need), and visitors were not allowed at the residential facilities. Clients who were receiving training in protective business units who also receive a portion of the income generated, are now forced to remain at home, with no means of supplementing their meagre disability grant for the foreseeable future. All of these clients as well children with severe disabilities in our special care centres received a daily cooked meal as part of our service to them. These preventative measures were taken to help flatten the curve but have left some of the most vulnerable groups even more exposed.
